



Schlumberger Sponsorship or SPE eLibrary for Chapters

SPE is excited about the opportunity of offering eLibrary subscriptions through the sponsorship program with Schlumberger. To obtain a subscription you will need to provide two contact people within the university. Please send an email to SPE which includes their names, address, phone, fax and email addresses.

SPE also requires that each subscribing organization sign a Terms of Use Agreement. This document is inserted below. Please sign it and fax it to +972-952-9435.

Once the contacts and signed Terms of Use have been received, our Service Department will process the subscription and issue a user ID number and password. The primary contact will be responsible for distributing the user ID and password to the students and faculty.

TERMS OF USE – UNIVERSITY SUBSCRIBERS

- Your subscription allows access to the SPE eLibrary through its website, www.SPE.org, to search for and download SPE papers. The subscription does not cover fax, email, or postal-service delivery of SPE papers.
- Your subscription provides access for authorized users – university, faculty, and enrolled students. It is your responsibility to protect eLibrary access information from unauthorized usage. As a subscriber, you are responsible for all security and use (including violations) of papers downloaded from the SPE eLibrary.
- Authorized users can (1) make searches of the eLibrary; (2) download papers to hard disk or diskette, provided that such data are not made available to anyone who is not an authorized user; and (3) make one or more copies in hard-copy form of papers from the eLibrary for the internal business use of the subscriber. No paper may be sold or in any manner, including electronic, be distributed to anyone who is not an authorized user.
- SPE reserves the right to suspend and/or terminate access to the SPE eLibrary upon violation of this agreement.
- SPE technical papers are copyrighted. The Society owns the copyright to papers in the SPE eLibrary, including any electronic form. Recompiling, copying (electronically or on hard copy) for other than personal use, or republication of the papers or any portion thereof, in any form or medium, is not permitted without written permission from SPE. Please review SPE's Permissions Policy (posted on www.SPE.org) or contact papers@spe.org for further information.
