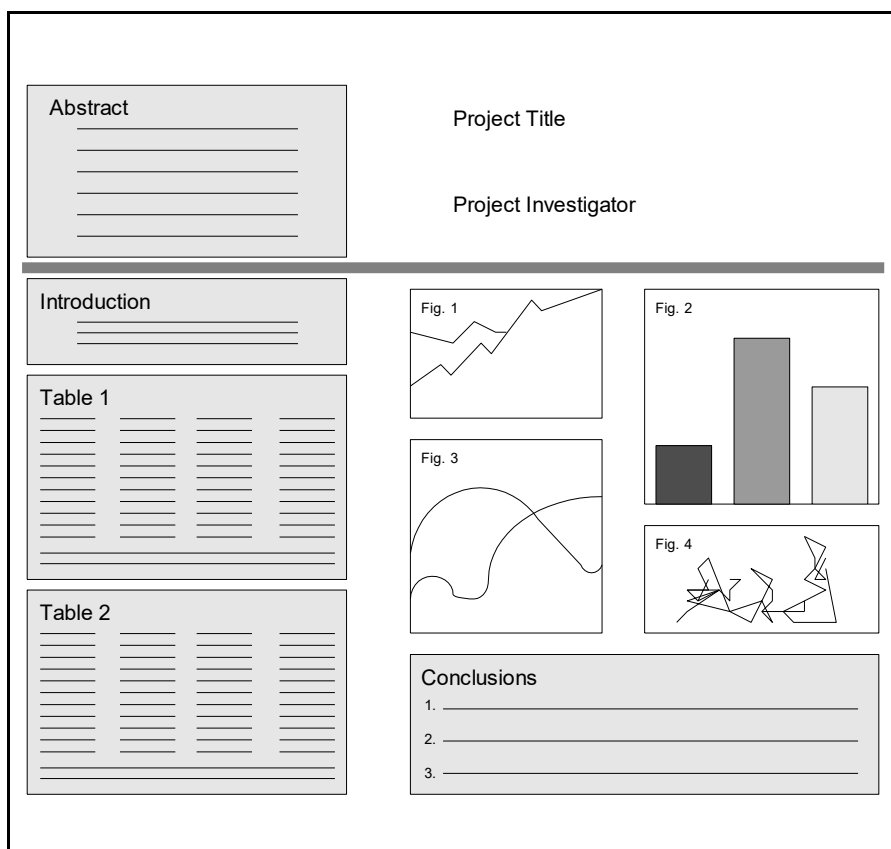


Poster sessions can be a valuable means of promoting discussion both within specific disciplines and across widely different research areas. A poster should be able to stand alone. A colleague should be able to determine the purpose, data, and significance of a project simply by looking at and reading the poster.

A clear title with the author's name, affiliation, address, and phone number is desirable, as well as an abstract in large bulletin type. Charts, drawings, and illustrations might well be similar to those ones would use for journal articles, or in making slides; however, they should be readable from a distance of several feet. It is best to keep illustrative material simple.

During the poster session, it may be useful for the author to have a tablet of suitable sketch paper on hand as well as felt markers for discussion purposes. We would like the author of the poster to be present during networking breaks/poster sessions.

A suggested arrangement of a poster is illustrated below;



- Identify project by title, author name, affiliation, address, and phone number.
- Include an abstract that summarizes the project.
- Include useful figures, tables, schemes, equations, pictures, a pocket for handouts, etc. Text should be kept to a minimum.
- Use contrasting colors.
- Lettering should be a minimum of 24 pt, as to be readable from a distance of several feet.
- **Please avoid commercialism** in your poster. If you deliver a good technical poster, the marketing will go hand in hand.
- Please display your company's logo only **once** on the poster.

Poster Size and Format

Please prepare 1 x A0 size poster, A0 = 841 (width) x 1189 mm (height) (portrait) and send your design before the **31st August 2026** to roos.vanherkhuizen@iadc.org. The conference program committee will be reviewing the draft Poster and provide you with feedback if needed. Your final Poster is due on the **11th of September 2026**.

Poster Setup & Dismantling

Please note that it's your own responsibility to print, bring and mount your poster to the poster standard. The setup of the posters takes place on Monday the 14th of September, from 7.00 PM – 11.00 PM. Dismantling takes place on Wednesday the 16th of September after 5.10 PM. Poster stands will be provided by the IADC. You can mount your poster using adhesive tape, which will also be provided.

Conference Proceedings: Posters and additional papers will be posted as part of the Conference Proceedings in a password-protected website in PDF format a few days after the conference. The link and password will only be provided to conference attendees and will be available for 60-days. If you do not wish to publish a PDF of your poster or wish to publish an alternate version, please let us know before **15th of September 2026**. Please note that an additional paper is encouraged but not required.
